



## Does the Church need an Electoral Roll??

Do you know what this is?

How does it help your Church?

How does it benefit you?


If you cannot answer all these questions perhaps it's time to suggest to the Church that we modernise some of the processes which the Church hangs onto.

How can you make such a suggestion? Approach your vicar, (which vicar), approach your over burdened Cburchwarden or try your Synod representative, if you know what this office holder is.

Whilst the Church is failing to communicate in modern terms we the Rural Church supporters are fighting a losing battle. We are asked to be compliant with an ever increasing burden of rules and regulations. Yet we never appear to reduce historical rules such as those surrounding the Electoral Roll.

There is an avalanche of top down rules to reflect modern issues (correctly so at certain levels) but no suggestions of how thoughts and voices from the grass roots may be heard or even acted upon in the interpretation of these. One size fits all or does it?

So returning to my electoral roll. Do we need it? Does it only serve to demonstrate our decline? Could it be rewritten, revamped, to be turned into something of actual use. Read the application form with an open mind. Welcoming? helpful? Useful? If your answer is no surely someone will listen...or will they? This could be a first step.

The Day the Music Died

It was 65 years ago, on 3rd February 1959, that American rock-and-roll performers Buddy Holly, Ritchie Valens and The Big Bopper were killed in a plane crash in Iowa. Thanks to Don McLean and his eight-minute hit song American Pie, it became known as "the day the music died". Buddy Holly was a rock 'n' roll pioneer who is widely regarded as having sparked a 'quantum leap' in popular musical output in the postwar years, being admired by such stars as Elvis Preslev and John Lennon. He was born in Lubbock, Texas, to a Christian family and attended a Baptist church where he made a commitment and was baptised.

At the time of the plane crash – attributed to their young pilot's inexperience in appalling weather conditions – Holly, 22, Valens, 17, and the 28-year-old Big Bopper (J P Richardson), together with other musicians, were on what they described as "the tour from hell", travelling hundreds of miles each day by bus in temperatures as low as minus 35F.

After a concert in Clear Lake, lowa, Holly decided to rent a private plane to get to Fargo, North Dakota, for the next concert. He planned to take his band members, Waylon Jennings and Tommy Allsup, with him, but Valens tossed a coin for Allsup's seat and won. Jennings then gave his seat to the Big Bopper, who was unwell.

Holly's young wife Maria learned about his death on television and suffered a miscarriage.


